#### **What is the Sports Premium?**

The Government is making available to all schools, an annual sum of money to enable them to improve the quality of sports provision within school and to increase pupil participation in sporting activity. Schools receive PE and sport premium funding based on the number of pupils.

#### **Our School**

St. Peter's C.E Primary School appreciates the contribution of P.E to the health and well-being of its children. We also acknowledge that a broad, balanced, high quality curriculum and extra-curricular activities have a positive impact on concentration, attitude and achievement.

Our team is committed to ensuring that all pupils receive a minimum of two hours of P.E per week, delivered by well-trained and enthusiastic teachers and coaches. The Sport Premium funding is allowing us to develop a sustainable improvement in teacher confidence and a new curriculum based on developing and offering progression in our children's physical skills.

We run a successful Sports Week every year where we provide opportunities for children to experience a range of sports. This week also includes competitive races for KS1 and KS2 in their Sports Days. This year, we are going to be holding a three-week Sports Event to celebrate the Olympics.

#### **Monitoring and Evaluation**
