<b>country</b>	A country is land that is controlled by a single government. Countries can be large or small.	Europe lays claim to the largest and smallest countries in the world. Russia is the biggest at 6.6 million square miles, while Vatican City is the smallest.		
<b>continent</b>	A continent is a large solid area of land. Earth has seven continents.	It is surrounded by two oceans which are called the Arctic and Atlantic.		 Location
