Pupil Premium Statement 2017 – 2018

At St Peter's C.E. Primary School we have high aspirations and ambitions for all our children and we believe that no child should be left behind. We are determined that every child should be given the chance to realise their full potential, whatever their background. Pupil premium represents a significant proportion of our budget and this statement outlines how it is spent to maximum effect.

- We seek to ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all of the pupils
- All teaching staff are involved in the analysis of data so that they are fully aware of strengths and weaknesses across the school
- All pupil premium children benefit from the funding, not just those who are underperforming

What is Pupil Premium?

Pupil premium is additional funding, from the government, provided to schools for supporting pupils from low income families and from other categories (See below). Research shows that pupils from deprived backgrounds underachieve compared to their non-deprived peers. The premium is provided to enable schools to 'close the gap' in attainment. In the 2016 - 2017 financial year the indicative budget is £33,480

Pupil Premium Categories and Principles

There are four categories of children that qualify for pupil premium:

- Children who are eligible for free school meals (FSM)
- Looked after children
- Post adoption children
- Armed forces children

What can schools spend it on?

Schools have the freedom to spend the Premium, in a way they think will best support the raising of attainment for the most vulnerable pupils.

All our staff and governors are committed to meeting **ALL** our children's pastoral, social and academic needs within a caring environment. The targeted and strategic use of pupil premium will support us in achieving our vision.



What are the main barriers to educational achievement?

SLT and Governors have identified four main barriers to achievement, these are:

- Opportunities and experiences
- SEND
- Learning behaviours
- Starting points

Where the pupil premium will be spent (approximate costs)	
To raise attainment in reading £215	Reading Plus TA intervention for IDL Consultant sessions.
One to One tuition £3000	5 x 1:1 tutors across KS1 and KS2. Tutors Working with identified pupils from school tracking to address gaps in learning.
Wave 3 sessions in KS1 £3900	Developing Literacy skills for targeted children
Additional TA hours in Year 6 for targeted support in English and Maths £3900	Extra TA hours in Year 6 to target children off track and support greater progress.
Additional targeted TA support for PP pupils Year 1 to Yr5 £6670	Extra TA hours in Years 1 to Year 5 to target children off track and support greater progress
Additional Teacher attached 0.5 to Support Year Upr KS2 £12,780	
Pupil welfare £375	Attendance support. Advice and support for vulnerable pupils.
Educational Visits £1000	Children to access termly educational visits and one residential visit per year from year 2-6
Residential Visits £1000	Children in years 4 and 6 to participate in Residential visits
Extra -curricular activities £1000	A range of extra -curricular clubs to extend opportunities and experiences
