Phonics and spelling focus: 'ea', 'oy', 'ir' and 'ue' phonemes.

Guidance: The spelling 'ea' has the same sound as 'ee'. 'oy' is used at the end of words and syllables. The 'ir' sound just needs to be learnt. Words ending with 'ue' (making an 'oo' or 'yoo' sound) are more common than using the 'oo' spelling.

Read the following instructions or press 'play' ▶ *and listen to the instructions.*

Listen carefully to the instructions I am going to give you. When I have finished reading them, I will answer any questions. You will not be able to ask any questions once the test has begun.

I am going to read six sentences to you. Each sentence has a word missing on the answer sheet. You should listen carefully to the missing word and fill this in, making sure you spell it correctly.

If you cannot work out an answer, leave the sentence gap blank. If you make a mistake, cross out the wrong answer and write the correct one above it or to the side.

First I'll read the word, then the word within a sentence, then I'll repeat the word again. At the end of the test, I will read out all of the six sentences again.

Now pause, or press 'pause' **II**. Ask the children if they have any questions. Once you have answered all the questions, read out the following. Alternatively, play the audio recording.

Summer Test 3

Spelling focus: il- and im- prefixes.

Guidance: Prefixes are groups of letters added to the beginning of words. Before a root word starting with 'l,' in- becomes il-, e.g. *legal – illegal*. Before a root word starting with 'm' or 'p,' in- becomes im-, e.g. *perfect – imperfect*. This spelling test also includes extra vocabulary taken from the *statutory word list*.

Read the following instructions or press 'play' ▶ *and listen to the instructions.*

Listen carefully to the instructions I am going to give you. When I have finished reading them, I will answer any questions. You will not be able to ask any questions once the test has begun.

I am going to read ten sentences to you. Each sentence has a word missing on the answer sheet. You should listen carefully to the missing word and fill this in, making sure you spell it correctly.

If you cannot work out an answer, leave the sentence gap blank. If you make a mistake, cross out the wrong answer and write the correct one above it or to the side.

Guidance: It is important for pupils to be able to spell and use words from other subjects. Pupils should read, spell and pronounce scientific vocabulary correctly (where appropriate). Note: 'Newton' must be spelt with a capital letter for a correct answer.
