

# Sport Premium Funding Report 2019 / 2020

For the academic Year September 2019 to July 2020 the school received £18,090 PE and Sport Premium Funding.

We must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of Physical Education, Sport and Physical Activity on offer to pupils.

The 5 key indicators where improvements should be seen are:

- 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity, aiming for 30 minutes a day within school time.
- 2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

The vision: To provide a wide range of activities open to all children, promoting engagement and self awareness throughout the school. Over the next two years, St Peter's will be a school that uses physical activity and sport as tool to develop children's own growth mindset, physical awareness, overall fitness and behaviour for learning. 100% of children will have the opportunity to take part in a variety clubs scheduled throughout the year, data will kept on increased participation and we will achieve the bronze sports award within 12 months. Opportunities will be available during lunchtime, which will improve behaviour and will take the pressure of lunchtime staff in an enclosed environment. Provision will be provided internally from staff and externally from local clubs and St Helens Sports Development Department. The school will be well resourced and activities never seen before will be introduced.

## Impact Statement:

- Inter house competitions were run and very successful. Sport became a focal point of the school and the profile of P.E.
- School Games Mark was unable to be achieved as applications closed as a result of Covid- 19.
- Sporting successes were celebrated weekly in whole school worships building a sense of achievement and pride. Sporting successes of children that had been selected to perform at a higher level i.e representing at inter- county competitions, selection for a Premier League Football club etc.
- School success in competitions has improved. A number of competitions were won successfully including Year 2 Mixed Football and Y5/6 Girls' Football competition.

## **Impact Statement**

- We attended a much higher number of competitions than the previous year (Autumn Term 1 and 2 and Spring 1).
- More children were able to attend sports competitions compared to the same period of time of the previous academic year.
