




Biome	A large region of Earth that has a certain climate and certain types of living things.	Rainforests are forests which grow in areas of high rainfall. Tropical rainforests are found between the Tropic of Cancer and the Tropic of Capricorn and receive between 175-200cm of rainfall a year.	 Place  Physical Processes  Human Processes
Climate Zone	Climate zones are areas with distinct climates . These zones might correspond to weather patterns, latitude, or communities of plants and animals.	<p>Rainforests are nearest to the equator, where the climate is very hot and wet all through the year.</p> <p>Rainforests are found in South America, Central America, Central Africa, Indonesia, Malaysia and the north eastern tip of Australia.</p>	
Dense Layers	<p>Compacted together and crowded.</p> <p>A thickness of some materials laid on or spread over a surface. The rainforest is divided into four layers: emergent, canopy, understory and the forest floor.</p>	<p>Cloud forests are another type of rainforest, so-called because they can be found high up mountains, where they are nearly always in cloud. The climate here is very cool but extremely wet.</p> <p>The world's largest remaining tropical rainforest is the Amazon which covers countries such as: Argentina, Peru, Paraguay and Uruguay but the majority, 60% of the Amazon, lies in Brazil.</p>	
Rainforest	A tropical forest, usually of tall, densely growing, broad-leaved evergreen trees in an area of high annual rainfall.	The hot and humid conditions encourage a wide variety of life in the rainforest. The average temperature is about 27 Degrees Celsius.	
Species	A class of individuals having some common characteristics or qualities.	Animals of the rainforest are provided with a variety of habitats in the different layers of the forest trees. Some live at the top of the tallest trees while others live in the lower zones.
