The term has drawn to a close with some wonderful events for our pupils. With the church packed, our juniors produced a very festive carol service with some excellent singing, readings, and poems. Thank you to all that came and took part, it was a lovely end to the year. Today, we had a special visitor! There were shrieks of delight as Santa walked up the corridor and entertained the children. Breakfast with Santa is always a special occasion and I hope our new Reception children enjoyed it as much as everyone else. Thank you also to Santa's little helpers (PTA) who provided the presents for Santa to hand out.

Last Friday, our Environment Hub was installed. There are still a few more things to do, including insulation, internal cladding and a 30m fence to be installed, however it's great to be well on our way to getting this fantastic resource ready for late Spring.

#### School performance data

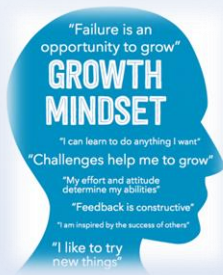
You can find our outstanding, more detailed school performance data on our website, however I thought it was worthwhile finishing of the year with some data that arrived recently and shows how well we are doing as a school nationally. In Phonics (Year 1) St Peter's was in the **top 3%** of schools in the county for attainment. By the end of Key Stage 2, we were in the **top 9%** for progress in reading and writing, the **top 8%** for reading attainment and the **top 7%** for writing attainment. Maths was not too far behind, with an **80% pass rate** as opposed to **72% nationally**. Our greater depth figures also show we are higher than the national average in reading, writing and maths combined. Reception class also performed outstandingly well, with **80%** achieving their good level of development grade as opposed to **67% nationally**. This is a testament to the hard work put in by the pupils, the staff and the support of parents. Reading at home, completing homework, trust in the school's curriculum processes and outstanding attendance ensures our children are supported at home and make excellent progress in school.

May I take this opportunity on behalf of all the staff to wish you and your family a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year and we look forward to seeing you on Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> January 2024.

**WELL DONE!**

As Christmas is just around the corner, this information may be helpful to parents and carers regarding Roblox. Roblox and SWGfL have collaborated together and created a checklist for parents which includes:

## What is Roblox?

Roblox is home to millions of immersive experiences, from gaming to social hangouts, to concerts, sports, fashion shows, education, and entertainment. Roblox is built by a global community of millions of developers and creators using Roblox tools and technology.

## Chat & privacy

All chat on Roblox is filtered to prevent inappropriate content, behaviour, and personally identifiable information from being visible on the site. This covers both private and public communications.

Players aged 13+ have the ability to use more words and phrases than younger players.



## Age Verification

Age Verification is a new feature that was introduced for testing in 2023. Age Verification will allow you to access age-appropriate content such as experiences for people 17 and up.

## Chat & interaction settings

- Click the **Gear Icon** in the upper right corner and click **Settings**
- On the right hand side of the **Settings** page click the **Privacy** option
- Here you can adjust the **Contact Settings** and **Other Settings**
- Players aged 12 and under can select either **Friends** or **No-one**, while players aged 13+ have additional interaction options
- Enabling **Account Restrictions** provides access to content that is appropriate for all audiences. Additionally, **Communication Settings** will be set to **Off**

## Voice Chat

Chat with voice allows eligible 13+ users to communicate using their voice in Roblox experiences. You can opt into Chat with voice by visiting the Settings page.

## Reporting a game

- To report an entire game:
  - Go to the **About** page for the game you wish to report.
  - In the lower right-hand corner of the **Description** box, click the red **Report Abuse** button

The **Report Abuse** button is in the same place on both the desktop and mobile versions.



## Reporting abuse in-game

Using the Report Abuse feature in a game will send information directly to Roblox. To report abuse from another user:

- Click on the **Menu** button in the top-left of the screen
- Click the **Flag Icon** next to a user's name, or click the tab at the top of the menu and select which user to report
- Click on the **Type of Abuse** drop-down menu to select the inappropriate action
- Enter details in the **Short Description** box
- Click **Submit** to finalise



- Click the **three dots** next to the user name and select **Report**
- Press the red **Report** button
- Fill out the report form
- Click the **Report Abuse** button to submit



## Blocking users in-game

- Click on [**your username**] in the upper-right corner of the game screen
- Click the user on the **Player List/Leaderboard**
- Select **Block User**

You can also choose to **Unblock** them or **Report Abuse** directly from this menu as well.

Blocked users are indicated by a circle with a line through it next to their username.

## Reporting chat on the website

To report chat made by another user:

- Click the **Gear Icon** in the upper-right corner of the chat window

## Parental controls

- Click the **Gear Icon** in the upper right corner and click **Settings**
- Select **Parental Controls** in the menu on the left-hand side of the screen
- In the **Parent PIN** section, press the **Toggle** button
- You will be asked to **create and confirm the PIN**
- When you're done, press **Add**



All parental control settings are protected by the account PIN, which will need to be entered in order to make any changes.

Creating a PIN requires a verified email address. You will be prompted to add and verify your email if the account does not have one.

## Experience Guidelines

Experience Guidelines recommends the content suitability of an experience. Age recommendations are grounded in child development research and informed by industry standards. You can use parental controls to manage the age-rated content your child has access to.

## Roblox Premium

Roblox has a monthly subscription service called Roblox Premium. It gives you access to features including buying, selling, and trading items, as well as increased revenue share on all sales in your games. Roblox revenue generated from users' own creations that are not owned by Roblox can be converted into currency.

If you have Roblox Premium, you will receive a monthly Robux deposit and have the icon below next to your account name.



## What are Robux and how are they used?

Robux are Roblox's in-game currency and can be used to purchase in-game upgrades or avatar accessories.

You can earn or purchase Robux by:

- Receiving a lump sum allowance as a **Roblox Premium** member
- Purchasing Robux from the **Robux page**

Be careful making purchases, as they can quickly add up.



**Beware of third-party sites that offer things like "free" or cheap Robux.**

**These scams attempt to hack your account and obtain personal information or Robux.**

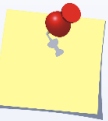

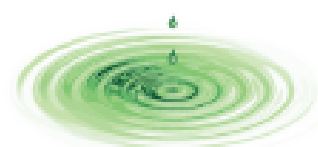

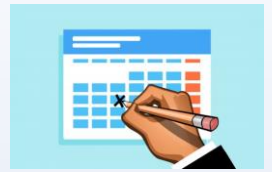

### Holiday Requests

Please note that all term time holiday requests will be unauthorised. Taking holidays during term time does have a detrimental effect on a child's education. Extended holidays in particular can be the difference between children achieving their year group objectives and not particularly if the pupil then is off for period of time with a sickness. Any pupil that falls below 94% attendance is classed as a cause for concern and will be contacted by the Education welfare Officer.

### ABSENCE

**When reporting on the absence line, can we politely request that you leave a brief description of your child's illness rather than just saying they are unwell.** If your child has vomiting or diarrhoea please note that they should not return to school for a period of 48 hours after the last incident. This is a local authority policy

Applications for Holiday Leave must be submitted to school at **least 4 weeks** in advance. Forms can be found on the school website or requested from the school office. In accordance with Government and Local Authority policy, holidays taken during term time will only be authorised in **exceptional circumstances**.

It is very important that if you change contact numbers, emails or addresses that you advise us as soon as possible. Any changes must be sent into school via email.
