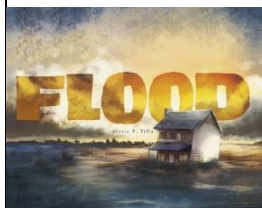

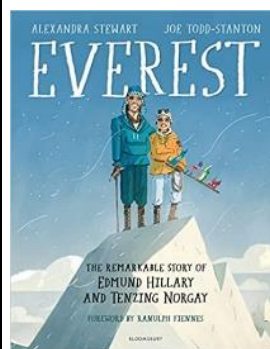

Year 6- What's in the News?



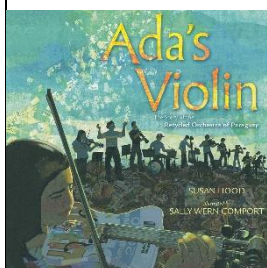

Year 5-Mountains



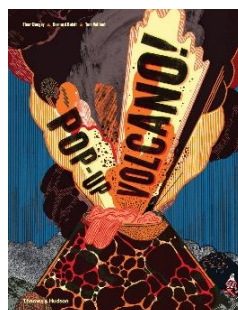

Year 4-South America



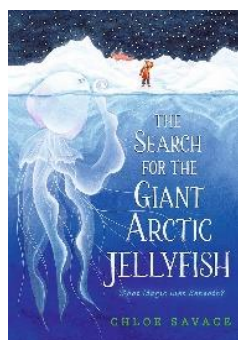

Year 2- Polar Regions



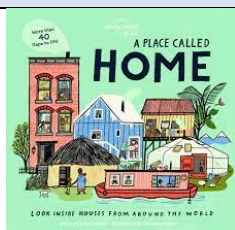
