We all have different approaches and feelings towards being assessed, even as adults, however our Year 6 children approached them brilliantly and we are very proud about how they coped and just got on with it. Whatever the results, they are all stars in our eyes.

Whilst Year 6 were busy doing their SATs, Reception, Year 1, 2, 3 and 4 all had a visit by the St Helens Road Safety Team. We do a lot of personal development at school and bringing external agencies in to deliver bespoke messages is really important. The Road Safety team visited each class and delivered some key messages about being safe around roads.

One reoccurring theme from our children was that on short journeys, many of the children told them that they don't were seatbelts or sit in child seats, often because they were just going to the shops or to a sports club. We hope to have them back again next year.

Please note that all term time holiday requests will be unauthorised. Taking holidays during term time does have a detrimental effect on a child's education. Extended holidays in particular can be the difference between children achieving their year group objectives and not particularly if the pupil then is off for period of time with a sickness. Any pupil that falls below 94% attendance is classed as a cause for concern and will be contacted by the Education welfare Officer.


Our Early Help approach
