ELIGIBILITY FOR FREE SCHOOL MEALS

A letter was sent home last week with further information on how to apply for free school meals.

If you think you may be entitled, please complete the form which has been sent home and return to school as soon as possible so that we can check on your behalf. Alternatively you can apply on line https://www.sthelens.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals

DINNER MONEY

If your child wishes to change their lunch preference please advise the office via email giving <u>a week's notice</u>.

Payment is taken through the School Money Online Payment System, please email stpeter@sthelens.org.uk if you are having issues accessing the system. Payments should be made by Monday to ensure the account is in credit and the system does not send payment reminders; we are obliged to follow the council's debt recovery process for accounts in arrears. Payment can be made for several weeks at a time, and credit does not need to by a week on week basis.

The current cost of school meals is £14.75 per week (£2.95 per day) for Years 3 to Years 6 pupils (who are not in receipt of free school meals); Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 receive a free school meal under the National Universal Infant School Meals initiative (UIFSM).

Notice to Year 6 Parents - Robinwood Residential


Our Early Help approach



ABSENCE

When reporting on the absence line, can we politely request that you leave a brief description of your child's illness rather than just saying they are unwell. If your child has vomiting or diarrhoea please note that they should not return to school for a period of 48 hours after the last incident. This is a local authority policy

Applications for Holiday Leave must be submitted to school at **least 4 week**s in advance. Forms can be found on the school website or requested from the school office. In accordance with Government and Local Authority policy, holidays taken during term time will only be authorised in **exceptional circumstances**.
